

Kootenay Lazer Tag Prices & Info

\$25.00 (inc Gst) per person for 7 or less people and includes 60 minutes game time

Add \$7.00 per person for every additional 20 minutes if reservations permit.

Birthday Package and Other Group Events

\$200.00 (inc Gst) for up to 10 players and inc 90 min of game time.

\$17.00 (inc Gst) for every additional player.

Add \$7.00 per person for every additional 20 min. If reservations permit.

Additional travel charges may apply for mobile events.

Allow an additional 15 minutes before your start time for registration and rules and allow some time after in case your game start time was delayed. We try to give you the time you have purchased so **Please be on time** as there may be other groups after you and any delays could shorten your playing time.

The playing field is quite large so we may make playing area smaller for a smaller group or it may be necessary to put other players in with your group, but in laser tag, the more the better.

Please wear appropriate footwear for running as there is lots of physical activity involved. **NO OPENED TOE SHOES ARE ALLOWED. Please wear Runners or good supporting shoes.**

Long pants are recommended as you will be running through bushes ect.

Outdoor Laser Tag is suitable for approximately 8 years and up but 6 year olds have played if accompanied by an adult.

Our Laser Tag guns do not emit any harmful laser beams

The signal is the same as your TV remote control, but will only work with our specially designed laser tag system

We are an outdoor facility so **dress for the weather**. We operate in light rain or shine.

The field is quite exposed to the elements so bring sunscreen and an umbrella. There is some covered areas for shade and seating for spectators but is limited. Feel free to bring a chair with you.

Please carpool as much as possible as parking is limited as well.

There is no water as of yet on site and 1 porta potty if it is not freezing.

We have a small concession that offers bottled water and chips. Players are welcome to bring their own snacks and non-alcoholic beverages to the field.
